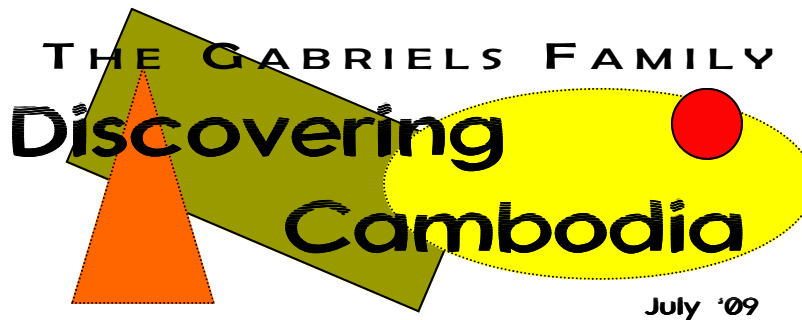

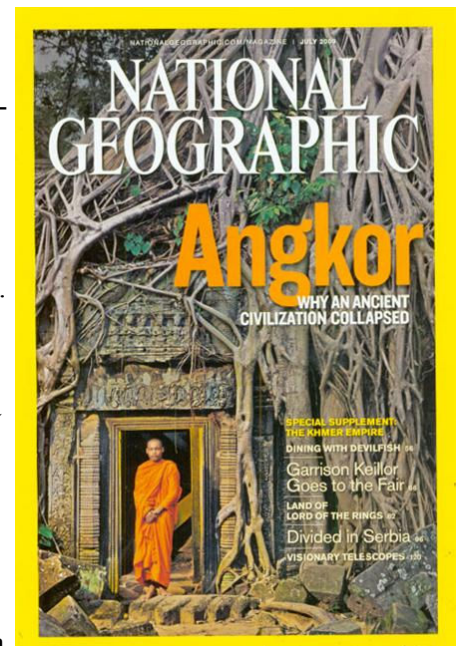
## Update on Us ...

This month's featured article in National Geographic magazine is on the ancient civilization of Cambodia, whose hub was located about 3-4 hours from where we currently live.

**News from Cambodia ...** There have been a number of developments in Preah Vihear since we wrote last. Our team leader, Joel, has been keeping us posted on the church and developments there. The best news yet is about a Firm Foundations Bible study that one of our recent emerging leaders in the church, Srey Toh, has been leading under the guidance of our teammate, Susan. Susan's landlord and two of his relatives have been attending, along with some others, and Susan says these 3 are now professing believers! This is exactly what we are looking for God to do—Khmer believers leading other Khmer to the Source of life. Praise God with us!

In other news, our team make up has changed. The Giancolas have come back to the States and will not be returning to Cambodia. We are now a team of 4 adults and our 3 children. In light of this change, we will not be having Sarah Breidenstien join us to help teach the children. Our teammates in the South East (Kampong Cham) now have 4 families who are home schooling their children. The need for a teacher is greater in that area, and so Sarah will be joining them this year.

And so, while we are on home assignment, life continues in Preah Vihear. We are excited to return in the Fall and join in the effort. We are all looking forward to returning, though saying goodbye to our dear friends and family here will be tough.
